RE: SCIP Database established under the Waste Framework Directive (WFD)

Dear Valued TTI Customer,

As a responsible business, TTI complies with environmental regulations worldwide to contribute to the protection of human health and environmentally sound recovery and disposal of electrical and electronic equipment. Therefore, TTI is continuously gathering and reviewing all essential information to fulfill the obligations regulated by European laws, including the duty to communicate information on substances in articles through the SCIP Database.

SCIP – **S**ubstances of **C**oncern In articles as such or in complex objects (**P**roducts) – is a database established and maintained by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) under the Waste Frame Directive (WFD), to ensure that the information on articles containing substances of very high concern (SVHCs) on the Candidate List in a concentration above 0.1% weight by weight (w/w) on the EU market is available throughout the whole lifecycle of products and materials, including at the waste stage. Companies supplying related articles have to submit information on these articles to ECHA, as from 5 January 2021. TTI, as a Supplier placing millions of articles on the EU market, has been working actively in this respect with our manufacturer partners and other parties on collecting and processing information and data. In addition, as Distributor and Importer, TTI relies on producers to provide necessary information in accordance with Article 9(1)(i) and 9(2) of the Directive (EU) 2018/851. As this process may take time, TTI will keep providing further details, including SCIP numbers and other information.
